WHEREAS, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees, and

WHEREAS, Arbor Day is observed in Blackfoot yearly by planting trees, and

WHEREAS, trees reduce the erosion in our city, moderates the temperature lowering our heating and cooling costs, cleans the air, and produces oxygen, and

WHEREAS, trees are a renewable resource giving us wood for our homes, fuel for our fires, paper for our use, and countless other wood products, and

WHEREAS, trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality, and beautify our community, and

WHEREAS, trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Paul M. Loomis, Mayor of the City of Blackfoot do hereby proclaim 12 May, 2016 as Arbor Day in the City of Blackfoot. I urge all citizens to support efforts in protecting our trees and woodlands.
